Dan in Green Gables

By Rey Terciero & Claudia Aguirre Young Adult Graphic Novel

Dan in Green Gables is a colorful reimagining of Anne of Green Gables, the classic novel that has inspired beloved books, movies, and TV shows. Anne's charming and eccentric spirit is channeled through Dan, a queer 14-year-old Dolly Parton diehard whose mom left him with his grandparents in rural Tennessee without even a goodbye. Dan doesn't always get along with everyone, but with stubbornness and a fierce love for the dramatics, he's able to make friends and find a place for himself in Green Gables.

I'm a fan of graphic novels that feel visually full; I read quickly, my eyes need something to do! Dan in Green Gables did not disappoint; it's absolutely gorgeous! The colors are vibrant, and its diverse cast of characters are detailed and dynamic. Dan explores the vulnerability of being himself, and like Anne, he's met with positive and negative responses. How do we really fit into a community, especially when it doesn't always accept us? How do we meet someone halfway, without giving up parts of ourselves? While this story does include heavy themes like homelessness, emotional and physical abuse, and homophobia, it stays upbeat and offers happy endings for everyone.

If you're a fan of the rich art style and playful tone of *Pumpkinheads* by Rainbow Rowell, then add this graphic novel to your fall to-reads!

Dr. Carlos Ramet, the author of two books of literary criticism and interpretation on bestselling novelist Ken Follett, will read from rare, unpublished works by Follett to discuss the writer's career path and "the road untaken" at Hoyt on Wednesday, November 5 at 6:30 p.m.

Ramet will discuss his own interest in writing, what he's learned about craft from studying Follett, and where his approach and Follett's diverge at "What Makes the Novel, Novel?", our 2025 National Novel Writing Month program. He will conclude by reading a selection from his recently published novel, The Quiet Limit of the World.



Ramet has taught creative writing at the collegiate level and is the author of more than twenty published short stories as well as numerous scholarly and nonfiction articles. A booksigning will follow.

Celebrate Hoyt Library's 135th Anniversary with us on November 1st

This year marks a remarkable milestone for one of Saginaw's most treasured institutions – Hoyt Library celebrates its 135th anniversary! Since its founding in 1890, Hoyt Library has stood as a beacon of knowledge, community, and architectural beauty in the heart of downtown Saginaw.

To celebrate, we are gathering together at the library for a community-inspired event! Join us **Saturday**, **November 1** for a variety of fun programs: a tour of the library with a behind-the-scenes point of view, a historical presentation from the Castle Museum of Saginaw County, a special birthday storytime, crafts and gifts, and more!

While Jesse Hoyt of New York was never a permanent resident of Saginaw, few people did more to promote the city's creation and growth. Hoyt became involved in every aspect of East Saginaw's economy: lumber, railroads, salt, banking, and buildings.



In his 1882 will, he left \$100,000 to build a library on land he owned. The arrangement of the will included that the name of the library always be Hoyt Public Library and that it be for consultation and reference only.

Building construction began in 1887, with the doors opening to the public for the first time on November 1, 1890. Hoyt Library has seen many changes over the years, including additions and renovations, but it continues to stand as a landmark – a visible sign of the strength, endurance, and vision of the people of Saginaw.
